Student Contribution Fee (i.e. 50% by 31 October and 50% by 15 January). Please contact the Fees Office directly.

It is the responsibility of the student to inform the Institute of previous time spent in third level education. Failure to do so may result in the retrospective collection of fees.

EU Students

In order to qualify under the Free Fees Initiative (*Tuition Fee Covered*), applicants must:

- Be a first time undergraduates **and**
- Hold EU Nationality or official refugee status **and**
- Have been ordinarily resident in an EU Member State for at least three of the five years preceding their entry to an approved third level course.

Non-EU Students

Students who reside in non-EU countries are liable for payment of fees at the non-EU rate.

Student Grants



Students must apply online to the grant authority Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI) at www.susi.ie

If you previously received a grant from SUSI you must ensure that you:

RENEW your application – where continuing your studies on the same course

APPLY – NEW – where entering a new or “add-on” course or changing course

APPLY – NEW – where continuing on a course but have never been in receipt of a student grant

Where official notification of a grant award is not submitted, the Student Contribution Fee must be paid by the student. If a grant is subsequently awarded, the Student Contribution Fee will be refunded. Please note that the material fee is not covered by any grant payment.

It is the responsibility of all students entering AIT for the first time, or any student whose grant status has changed, to **submit official notification from the relevant grant authority to the Institute’s Fees Office.**

Your fee calculation is based on information currently available to us. Please note that this fee is subject to change.
